What Is The Will Of God?

Introduction: Mark 3:35 The expression "will of God" is often misused. Here are four ways the Bible uses it.

1. What God Causes

- * The unconditional will of God
- * Eg. creation, natural laws, etc. Revelation 4:11 (NKJV)
- * Galatians 1:4 the execution of the eternal plan of salvation
- * A mistake is made though, to think all happenings are unconditionally the will of God. This is fatalism.
- * This facet of God's will cannot be affected in the least by man's will

2. What God Wants

- * I Thessalonians 4:3 God wants us to abstain, but does not make us.
- * Our freewill is taken into consideration
- * I Thess. 5:18 He wants us to give thanks
- * I Peter 2:15 God wants us to do good
- * I John 2:17
- * "I hope this is the will of God" does not apply here
- * We can know this aspect of God's will...it is revealed in Scripture Romans 2:17-18
- * God wants us to use the Scriptures to make discernments about good and evil. It is God's will.

3. What God Allows

- * Romans 1:9-10 What God permits to happen
- * James 4:15 Uncertainty of future life
- * Is it God's will that I come to this Bible class?
- * Did God will that I wear these clothes today?
- * Does God determine where I should go, live or what activities I should involve myself in?
- * God allows much of our lives to be exposed to time and chance Ecclesiastes 9:11

4. What God Assists

- * This is providence
- * Next to impossible to know for certain
- * Heal the sick, give us our daily bread, provide me a job, reaching the lost, giving us wisdom, etc.
- * Bringing you a spouse? How about a bad marriage? Remember Hosea?
- * Sufferings I Peter 3:17 Paul's thorn in the flesh Jesus cup of suffering
- * Prosper in all things? III John 2
