Who Is A Christian?

Introduction: The word "Christian" is often misused. We hear of a "Christian" massacre, a "Christian" nation, "UNchristian" behavior, etc. Catholics and Protestants terrorize one another in Northern Ireland...both claiming to be Christians. Many misunderstand the term. But what does the **Bible** say? And more especially are YOU a Christian?

I) Who Is A Christian? (negative)

- A) Old Testament Faithful; e.g. Abraham. Isaac, Jacob, Moses, David, etc.? No!
 - * They lived **before** Christ. See Matthew 11:10,11
- B) A Morally Good Person? Not necessarily!
 - * This would have to include some atheists and Moslems, etc. Read Acts 10:1,2; 11:12-14
- C) A Believer in Jesus Christ? Not necessarily!
 - * Consider John 12:42,43 and Luke 12:8,9
- D) A Person Who Is Zealous For God? Not necessarily!
 - * Many may associate zeal with being right; e.g. cults, Jehovah's Witnesses, Mormons, evangelicals, etc.
 - * Notice Romans 10:1-3 & Acts 22:3-10
- E) One Who Has Been Baptized? Not always!
 - * See Acts 19:1-7
- F) A Churchgoer? Not always!
 - * I Corinthians 14:23 shows unbelievers can attend assemblies of the church.
- G) Children of Parents Who Are Christians? No!
 - * Where is the Scripture describing GRANDchildren of God?
- H) The Well-off Of The World? No!
 - * Prosperity is no proof of God's favor. See Mark 10:23-26

II) Who Is A Christian? (positive)

- A) A *Disciple* Of Christ Acts 11:26
- B) A Follower Of Christ Luke 14:27,33
- C) One Who Has <u>Properly Begun</u> To Follow Matthew 28:18-20 "Go make disciples baptizing them..." Illust. "Go make soldiers of these new recruits training them..." Imagine a man going to war without joining the military.
- D) One Who <u>Continues</u> To Follow John 8:31; Mt.28:20; I John 2:6. Illust. "following" a recipe, map directions, a parent's instructions, etc. No more. No less. No presumption allowed. Illust. Peanut butter and jelly on the Lord's Supper bread; instrumental music in worship; leaving off baptism, etc.
- E) One Who Becomes <u>Christlike</u> in following Luke 6:40; Romans 8:29. Can you imagine a "disciple" of Karl Marx not promoting his philosophy? Not knowing his writings? The same can be said of a disciple of Christ!

Conclusion: Are you truly a *Christian?* According to God's definition? The New Testament also instructs Christians to join themselves to a group of Christians for collective service. A Christian "at large" is nowhere taught in Scripture. He must find a congregation that *follows* Christ in worship, work, teaching, organization...in every way, for *following* is the essence of true Christianity.
